

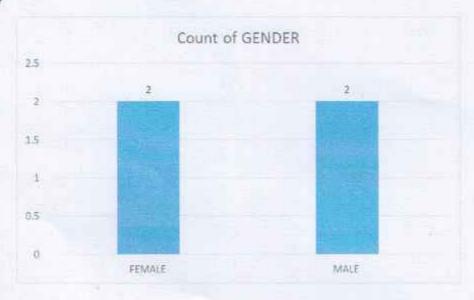
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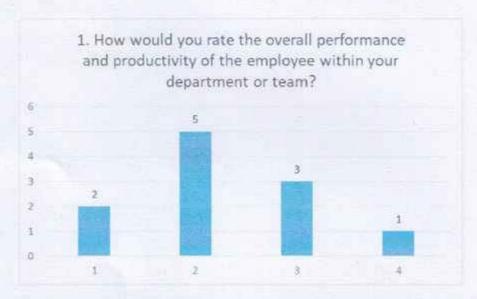

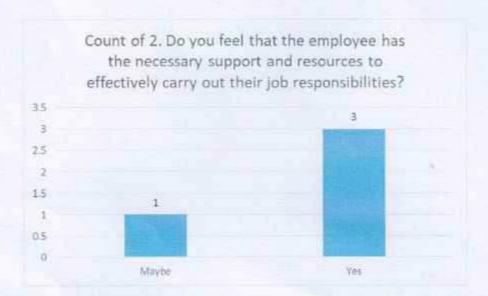

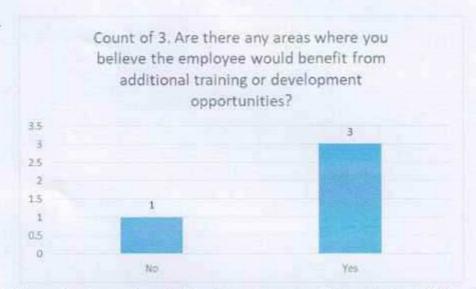
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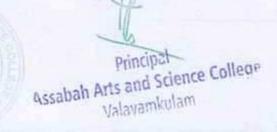
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Most respondents (5) rated the employee's overall performance and productivity within the department or team as 2 out of 5, with lower ratings from the remaining respondents.



The chart indicates that 3 respondents believe the employee would benefit from additional training or development opportunities, while 1 respondent does not.



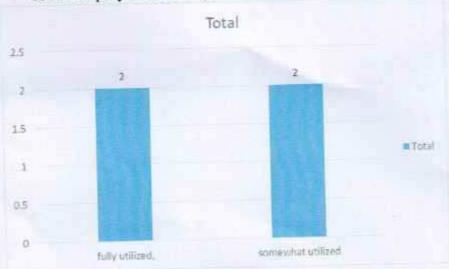


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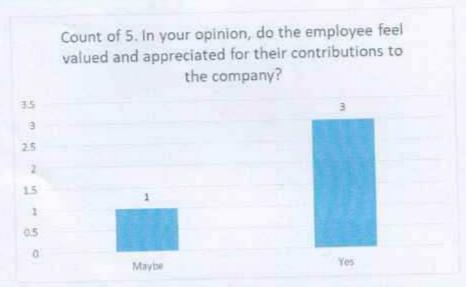
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Count of 4. How well do you think the skills and strengths of the employee are being utilized in their current roles?

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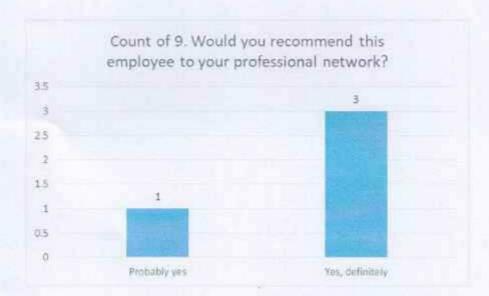
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Count of 8. How effectively do you think the employee collaborates and works together as a team to achieve common goals?
